Batting: Matilda's Own 99M400, 94" (240 cm) wide 42" (105 cm)
In addition: Matching sewing and quilting thread.

## CUTTING ${ }^{2}$ :

$1 / 4$ " $(0,75 \mathrm{~cm})$ seam allowance is included.

SEWING OF QUILT TOP: Seam allowance is $1 / 4 "(0,75 \mathrm{~cm})$.
Start making the half square triangles. Take the squares in fabric $E 5 \times 5$ " $(12,5 \times 12,5 \mathrm{~cm})$.
In order to have correct placement of the motifs it's important to follow below method.

On 8 pcs draw a diagonal line from left bottom corner to right top corner (1.).

And on 8 pcs draw a diagonal line from
 left top corner to right bottom corner (2.).

Now take one square in fabric $E$ and one square in fabric $A$. With right sides together sew on both sides of the drawn line. Cut at drawn line and two squares come forward, see sketch.

For some half square triangle only one side of the drawn line must be sewn.
 Pls. keep the leftover from other side because it must be used for the mixed half square triangles when fabric $A \& D$ must be joined.

Overview of half square triangles for version 1.:
Fabric E \& A: 2 squares - will be 4 half square triangles. Only sew 3 pcs. Keep leftover. Fabric E \& B: 2 squares - will be 4 half square triangles. Only sew 3 pcs. Keep leftover. Fabric E \& C: 2 squares - will be 4 half square triangles. Only sew 3 pcs. Keep leftover. Fabric E \& D: 2 squares - will be 4 half square triangles. Only sew 3 pcs. Keep leftover. Fabric A \& D: 1 triangle from leftover of each fabric to be joined as half square triangle. Fabric $B \& C: 1$ triangle from leftover of each fabric to be joined as half square triangle.

Overview of half square triangles for version 2 .:
Fabric E \& A: 2 squares - will be 4 half square triangles. Only sew 3 pcs. Keep leftover.
Fabric E \& B: 2 squares - will be 4 half square triangles. Only sew 3 pcs. Keep leftover.
Fabric E \& C: 2 squares - will be 4 half square triangles. Only sew 3 pcs. Keep leftover.
Fabric E \& D: 2 squares - will be 4 half square triangles. Only sew 3 pcs. Keep leftover.
Fabric A \& B: 1 triangle from leftover of each fabric to be joined as half square triangle.
Fabric C \& D: 1 triangle from leftover of each fabric to be joined as half square triangle.

Now position all pieces for the quilt center according to layout on page 4, using the big squares in fabric A-D $81 / 2 \times 81 / 2^{\prime \prime}(21,5 \times 21,5 \mathrm{~cm})$, the smaller squares in fabric $E 41 / 2 \times 41 / 2^{\prime \prime}(11,5 \times 11,5$ cm ) and the half square triangles.

Join the center quilt in four quaters, again see layout on page 4.
For one quater, start by joining smaller blocks with number 2, $3 \& 4$. Join these blocks to the big block $81 / 2 \times 81 / 2^{\prime \prime}(21,5 \times 21,5 \mathrm{~cm})$, following the numbers of the blocks.

Three more quarters has to be joined like this. Be aware that the star is placed differently so the smaller blocks are also placed differently.

Now join the four quarters and the quilt center is created.
Next join the strips in fabric $F$ (border) on all sides of the quilt center. At first join the strips to the left and right sides and at last join the strips at the top and bottom.

## QUILTING AND BINDING:

Layer top, batting and backing in fabric G and baste the pieces.
Quilt as you prefer by hand or by machine $\boldsymbol{\vartheta}$.
Sew hanging sleeve in fabric $G$ and place under top binding in fabric $E \boldsymbol{\vartheta}$.
